**Note to 37 a):**

The original self-adhesives were the brainchild of two philatelic entrepreneurs -- Mr Derek Worboys and Mr John Daynes who both submitted orders for these Machin octagonal die-stamped designs to Her Majesty's Stationery Office to be produced on self-adhesive paper. These stamps were produced in late 1973 just prior to this special service being withdrawn. The 1st Series was duly issued on **February 10th 1974**, which was the exact date of the 10th Anniversary of the sierra Leone self-adhesive Issue." (note): Sierra Leone was the first country in the world to issue self-adhesive stamps and did so in 1964.)



Series 1 consists of five values -- ½p (light blue), 1p (crimson or maroon), 1½p (grey-black), 5½p (a se-tenant 5p light violet value with a ½p light blue) and 8p (a se-tenant 5p with 3p).



SG 1789 - **19th Oct 1993** - 1st Class orange-red Self-Adhesive. 2 phosphor bands. Perf 14 x 15 and one elliptical hole on each vertical side. Initially sold at 24p but increased to 25p from 1 Nov 1993. Only issued in booklets containing 20 stamps - SG MG1 (£4.80 - £5).



**GB goes self-adhesive**
